

With tear-stained cheeks, Lee-Ann took what Michael said to heart.

"I remember thinking, 'How am I here at this point right now with my husband sharing these last words with me?'"

Lee-Ann said. "And my heart just felt like it was breaking at one minute, but the next minute I just felt this overwhelming sense of love and thankfulness to the Lord because I left that conversation knowing that first and foremost, my husband loved the Lord. And second that he loved the kids and me."

Lee-Ann needed every ounce of that gratitude to endure. She settled into

the waiting room at Kettering Health Main Campus, where Michael had been transferred for his surgery, having no idea she'd wait for news about Michael for almost 11 hours.

Still, she found pockets of solace in friendly faces along the way.

"One of the guys in the ambulance found me and said, 'Your husband wanted me to tell you that he loves you very much,'" Lee-Ann recalled.
"I thought, 'Lord, what a sweet blessing to have.'"

What were hours of waiting for everyone else felt like minutes for Michael. The first

words Michael remembers hearing when he woke shaped his story as much as the ones he thought would be his last.

"The first thing the nurses and doctors told me was that it was a miracle,"
Michael said. He didn't want to leave his wife and kids behind, and knew he had plenty of memories yet to make with Lee-Ann and his children.

And thus began the period Michael calls his "bonus round": the extra time Michael never expected to have.

# A Miracle and a Second Chance: THE MCKAYS' STORY

Michael McKay and his wife, Lee-Ann, awoke to an unremarkable Saturday. With little on their to-do lists, they looked forward to a lazy day around the house. But then Michael felt a sharp pain in his neck.

He tried to walk it off. But a potentially tweaked back soon gave way to a completely numb left leg. Lee-Ann found Michael scooting down the stairs, unable to trust his body to walk him down safely.

"We drove to the emergency room at Kettering Health Greene Memorial just down the road," Michael said. "Thankfully we were only a short distance from that hospital." Two CT scans revealed a dissected aorta in Michael's heart. He would need emergency open-heart surgery.

A sobering quiet blanketed Michael's room as he and Lee-Ann waited for his lifesaving procedure.

"One of the first things that I told Lee-Ann was, 'I don't want you to be angry at the Lord for what's going on here. I don't want you to be bitter.' I know a lot of people blame God for the things that happen in their life that they might consider evil or bad. But I didn't want my wife and kids to wrestle with that," Michael said. "I wanted them to know their dad and their husband was dying very grateful for the life that he had been given."

# SPEAK with Intent

### FROM ADVOCATE, TO PATIENT, TO ADVOCATE: JERI WARD'S STORY

Jeri Ward heard a pop, then a fizzle in the back of her head.

All she could do was toss her laptop to the floor, getting her husband Dean's attention. The nonsensical words that escaped Jeri's lips were so shocking, she giggled. But the fear in her eyes told her husband this was serious.

Finally, she forced the right word out: "hospital."

Jeri entered the emergency room and realized she could not remember her social security number—or any numbers.

Jumping into action, the Emergency team ordered a CT scan that confirmed their fears: Jeri was having a stroke.

The complexities of the blood clots in Jeri's brain required a three—hour thrombectomy—a procedure that typically takes an hour. Jeri was awake the whole time.

"Here I am, just 30 years old, lying on a surgery table, and I can see my brain on the screen in front of me," Jeri said.

Unable to speak or move, Jeri the advocate, the humanitarian, the voice, had to be Jeri the patient. Her body gave her no choice. As Jeri cried, unable to communicate, her nurse anesthetist held her hand for the entirety of the procedure. "It made me feel a bit more calm." Jeri

said. "I stopped crying at that point because I felt that human connection."

Jeri's surgery ended around 3 a.m., and her husband had sat panicked in the waiting room for almost four hours. Akil Patel, MD, neurosurgeon, delivered the news to Jeri's husband. She had made it through the surgery, but there was a long road ahead. The next 10 months held challenges for Jeri that most people expect to face only once in life—learning to speak, write, and even eat again.

Her stroke took a lot from her. But there is one thing it gave her—a new voice. As she learned to speak, Jeri lost her Southern accent, adopting one infused with her husband's English accent. Though her voice may sound a bit different, she's using it the same way—to advocate for others.

She didn't know it at the time, but this moment where she felt most powerless would determine the trajectory of the rest of her life. Jeri now works at Life Connection, a nonprofit that coordinates lifesaving organ donations. She brings a perspective to her job many other professionals may not have.

"I firmly believe this was supposed to happen," Jeri said. "People always think I'm nuts when I say that, but it's really hard for medical professionals or people in law or research to understand stroke fully, because they never had it happen.

"I think going from not having a voice to being able to speak to people in 36 countries, it's magical. It's just insane. But I think that's a testimony to having willpower to overcome obstacles that seem impossible at the time."

Though Jeri always knew her purpose was rooted in service to others, everything clicked after her stroke.

"Knowing that people go to the hospital because of the education that I've shared makes me feel like all this terrible time and struggle and heartache and depression and anxiety was all worth it," Jeri said. "Without this experience, I wouldn't have been able to save as many lives as I have."


